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	Site security, verbal, physical assault and theft		Be vigilant at all times. If a situation occurs, telephone the Police if necessary and contact the Parish Council.	1	1	Low	
	Excessive noise		Be mindful of other stallholders and the general public where noise from your stall is concerned.	1	3	Low	
	Litter and pollution from your stall		Refuse must be taken by the stallholder at the end of the market day.	2	2	Low	
	Food preparation, service etc. issues		Individual traders must hold their own basic food hygiene certificate and is recommended to attend refresher training at least every 3 years and food preparation licenses and certification	3	2	Medium	Include in T & Cs need to hold own licence/hygiene certificate
	Faulty products, personal illness or injury		Ensure that all products sold on the market comply with Trading Standards. Ensure that you and your other stall operators are physically fit enough to work on market days.	3	2	Medium	
	Food poisoning		Ensure that all perishable stock is kept chilled by the use of refrigeration, ice or cold blocks – ideally less than 5C.	3	2	Medium	Include in T & Cs need to hold own licence/hygiene certificate
	Service of food or drink		Traders selling food or drink must be registered with the local authority where it is normally kept under the provisions of the Food Premises (registration) Regulations 1991.	3	2	Medium	

Generators	Must be examined by the Parish Council before use on the market. Ensure generator does not burn personnel from the exhaust or cause excessive noise.	2	2	Low	
Danger from Calor Gas	Follow Calor Gas safety guidelines. <a href="http://www.calor.co.uk/gas-bottles/gas-cylinder-safety">http://www.calor.co.uk/gas-bottles/gas-cylinder-safety</a>	4	1	Low	
Danger from electrical equipment	It is the stall holders responsibility to ensure that all electrical equipment used on their stall carries the CE mark and has been PAT tested	4	1	Low	
Transmission of Covid 19 or other high Consequence Infectious Disease	The Parish Council will display posters reminding the public of the need to social distance, not attend market and return home to self isolate if displaying symptoms, wash/sanitise hands before touching produce at the market and any provision recommended by central government. Stalls to be sufficiently far apart to enable the stall holders and public to social distance with ease. Stall holders to provide hand sanitiser stall on their stall free of charge for customers to use before touching produce.	4	2	Medium	Market is operating outdoors where transmission risk is reduced.

<b>LIKELIHOOD</b>	1. Very unlikely – could happen but probably never will	2. Unlikely – could happen but only rarely	3. Even chance	4. Likely – could happen occasionally	5. Very Likely – could happen regularly
<b>SEVERITY</b>	1. Negligible (delay only)	2. Slight - First aid or minor damage to the environment or minor business interruption	3. Moderate – Lost time injury, illness, damage, lost business	4. High – major injury/damage – lost time business interruption	5. Very high – fatality, business closure, major damage to the environment

**Note: To score the risk please multiply the Likelihood factor by the Severity factor**

**RISK SCORING (PRIORITY)**    0-5 Low    6-11 Medium    12-25 High
